Frequently Asked Questions About Filing a Claim

Q: When should I file a claim?

A: Claims can be made anytime you are disabled and unable to work. Complete the claim form after the doctor says you cannot work.

Yes, you can file a claim during summer or winter break!

Return the packet to the Benefits Office for processing.

O: Is my claim information kept confidential?

CONFIDENTIAL

A: Every piece of information about you and your claim is confidential. TheStandard does not discuss your claim with anyone other than you unless you give written authorization to do so.

Q: How long does it normally take to make a claim decision?

A: Prompt claim resolution and payment is important to TheStandard. They strive to make claim decisions within 5-7 business days after they receive all three components of your claim (statements from Employee, Physician, and Employer). Contractually, they have 60 days to pay or deny a claim from the received date. If further information is needed, they will notify you immediately.

O: If my claim for disability benefits is approved, how long will it take to receive my first check?

A: After your claim has been approved and your benefit waiting period has been satisfied, you will receive your first benefit check within three to five business days following your first month of disability. Benefits are typically paid on a monthly basis.

O: Are my disability benefits taxable?

A: Your disability insurance benefits are not taxable because your disability coverage/premiums are paid with after-tax dollars.

Q: What if I am thinking about returning to work?

A: When you're considering returning to work, contact your claim specialist at TheStandard. The specialist will help answer your questions and identify documentation you may need to ensure your claim is administered correctly.

When you return to work, you will need to provide a doctor's release to Rhonda Ferrin in Personnel (<u>RFerrin@mesquiteisd.org</u>) and to TheStandard.

First Day Hospital Benefit

With this benefit, if an insured employee is admitted as a hospital inpatient for at least four hours during the Benefit Waiting Period, (not for outpatient procedures) the Benefit Waiting Period will be satisfied. Benefits become payable on the date of hospitalization; the maximum benefit period also begins on that date. This feature is included only on LTD plans with Benefit Waiting Periods of 14 days or less.



Emergency Response Vehicle

- Disability coverage has a preexisting condition limitation for 12 months prior to effective date of coverage.
- ♦ During benefits annual enrollment, employees may increase monthly benefits by \$300 and go down one plan level without triggering the pre-ex limitation.
- You cannot file a Disability claim for a Workers Compensation injury.
